



#### PERCENT OF STATE POPULATION ENROLLED

# STATE SPENDING PER CHILD ENROLLED (2006 DOLLARS)





he Missouri Preschool Project (MPP) began in 1998, with funding from gaming revenues through the Early Childhood Development Education and Care Fund. The program serves 3- and 4-year-olds. A competitive grant process is used to award funds, and programs operate in public schools as well as private child care centers and nonprofit agencies. There are no set enrollment criteria for MPP, but programs serving children with special needs or from low-income families are prioritized for grant awards. Local programs develop sliding payment scales based on criteria such as free or reduced-price lunch eligibility.


Grantees must set aside at least 10 percent of their MPP funding to provide professional development opportunities for teachers working for other licensed programs within the same community. New teachers hired after July 1, 2005 must have the same qualifications as public school teachers, including a bachelor's degree and specialization in early childhood, regardless of program setting.

- <sup>1</sup> Programs are also offered by 52 private providers and 13 non-profit programs.
- <sup>2</sup> Programs are funded through a competitive process and receive extra points for serving children with special needs or from low-income families.
- <sup>3</sup> Programs apply as either a full-day or half-day program. Programs awarded in 1998-1999 had the option of operating 4 days per week with the fifth day for home visiting, but this practice is being phased out. Programs are required to operate for a minimum of 9 months, but may choose to operate year-round.
- <sup>4</sup> Effective with the 2005-2006 school year, newly hired teachers in nonpublic settings must have the same qualifications as teachers in public school settings. The previous requirement was a CDA.
- <sup>5</sup> Child care licensing requires full-day programs to offer lunch and two snacks and half-day programs to offer morning or afternoon snacks.
- <sup>6</sup> Monitoring activities include review of programs' records and annual evaluations for all teachers.
